Installation

Preparations

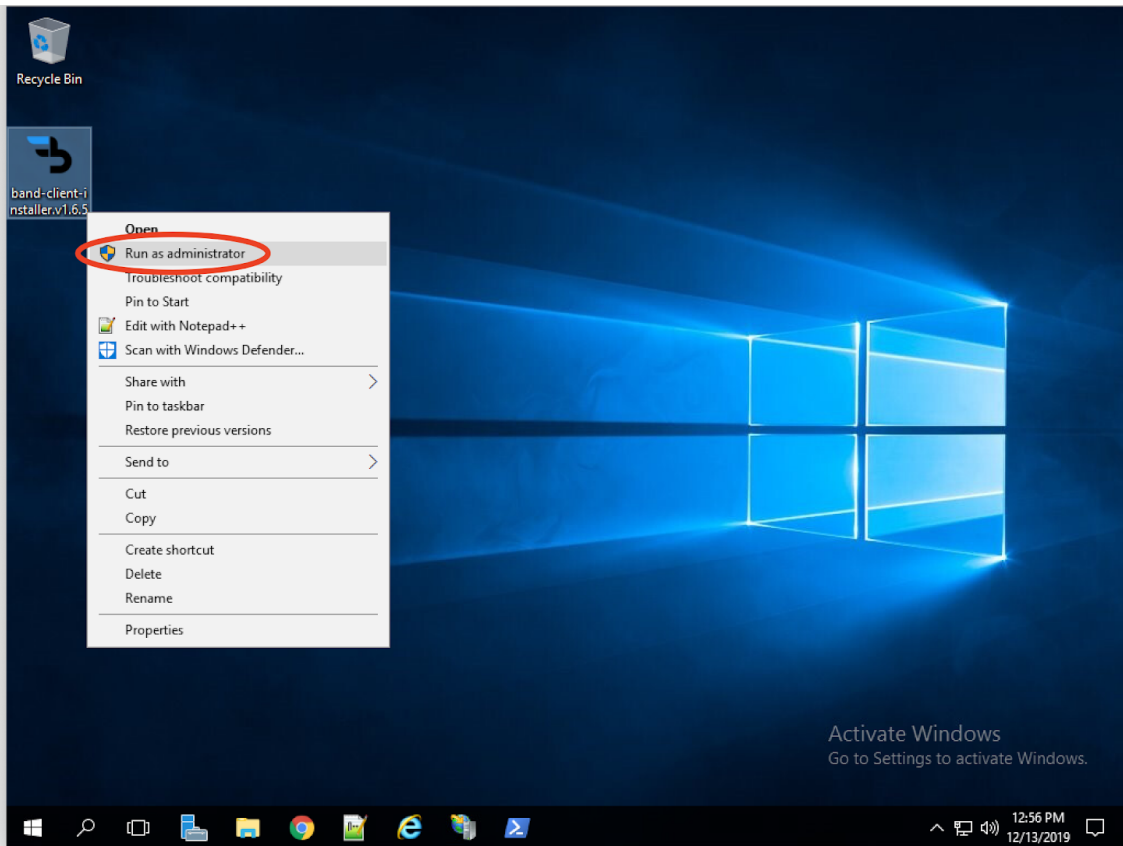
To install the band kiosk, you must have:

- Band server URL
- Administrator privileges on the machine Band will be installed on

Run Installer

Locate the Band Client Installer on the device. For version 1.6.5, the name of the installer will be **Band Client Installer v1.6.5** with a Bunch Icon.

Right click on the installer, and select **Run as administrator**.



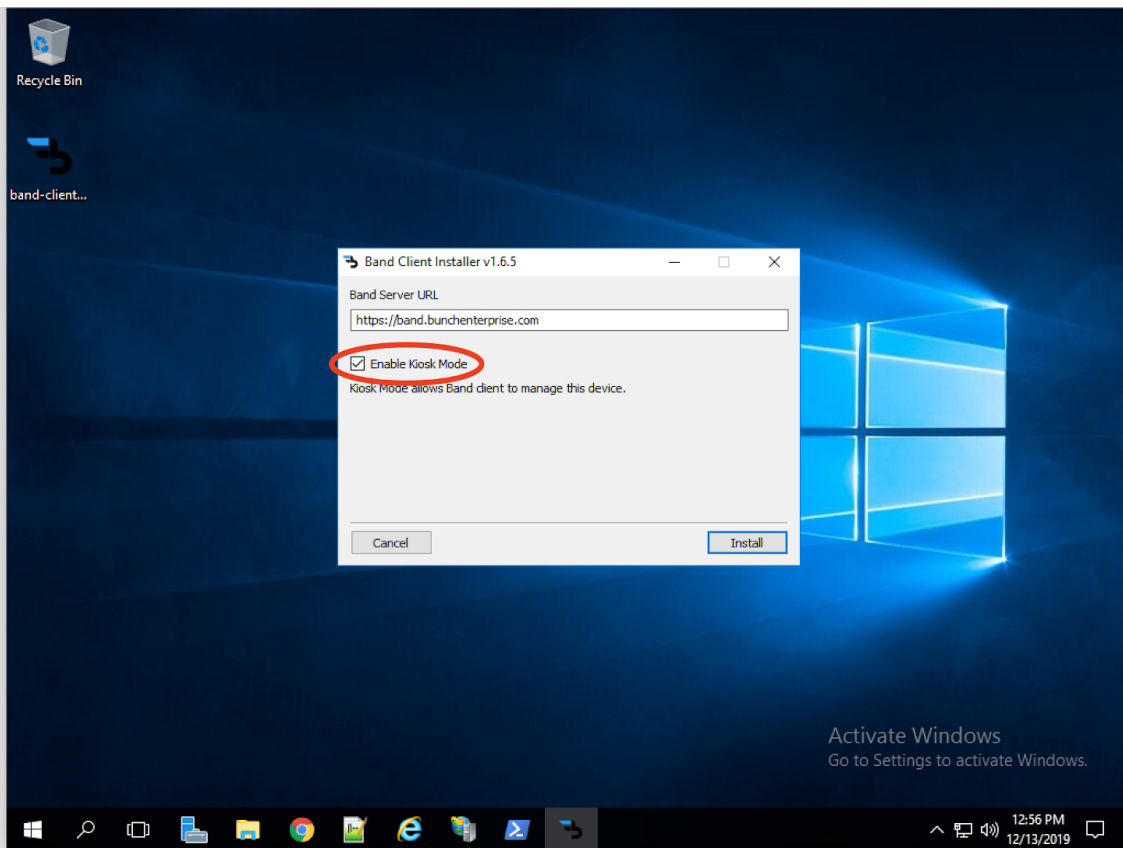
You may be prompted to allow the Band installer to make changes to your device - if prompted, click **Yes** to continue.

Enter the **Band server URL** in the input field. If the Band server URL is **<https://band.bunchenterprise.com>**, then enter <https://band.bunchenterprise.com>.

Check the box named **Enable Kiosk Mode**.

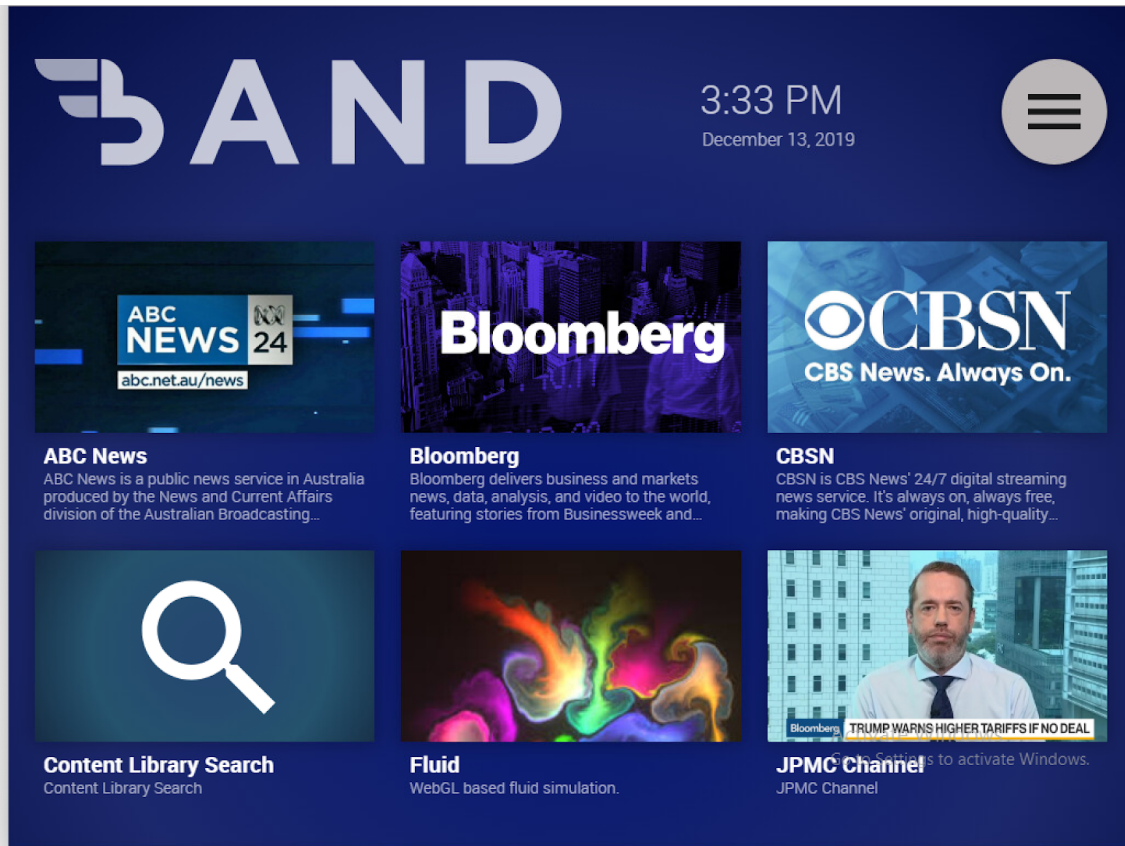
Click **Install**.

Kiosk mode will install Blend, a supported version of Chrome, and make adjustments to the device's settings to launch Chrome on boot to the Band server URL.



If kiosk mode is unchecked, the installer will only install the Blend application to the device and Chrome will not launch Band on boot.

The device will restart once the installer has completed. After the device is logged in, a Chrome window will be launched with the Band server URL preloaded. This may take up to a few minutes depending on the device.



The Chrome window is in kiosk mode, which disables the address bar and toolbars.

To exit kiosk mode, you must quit Chrome by pressing Alt + F4 on the keyboard.
